Using the words of Kristijan's friends and family interviewed over many months, the result is a powerful mix of sadness, loss, and ultimately love, laced with humour. 'April's Fool' promises to be thought-provoking and ultimately optimistic reflection on how we all live our lives.

Young people, parents, teachers, youth workers and theatre critics universally praised April's Fool for its ability to engage them in this story, gently sharing with its audience and at no time to seeking to lecture or preach. The result is a theatre experience that reflects Kristijan himself - loving, warm, generous, open, honourable, gentle, complex and provocative.

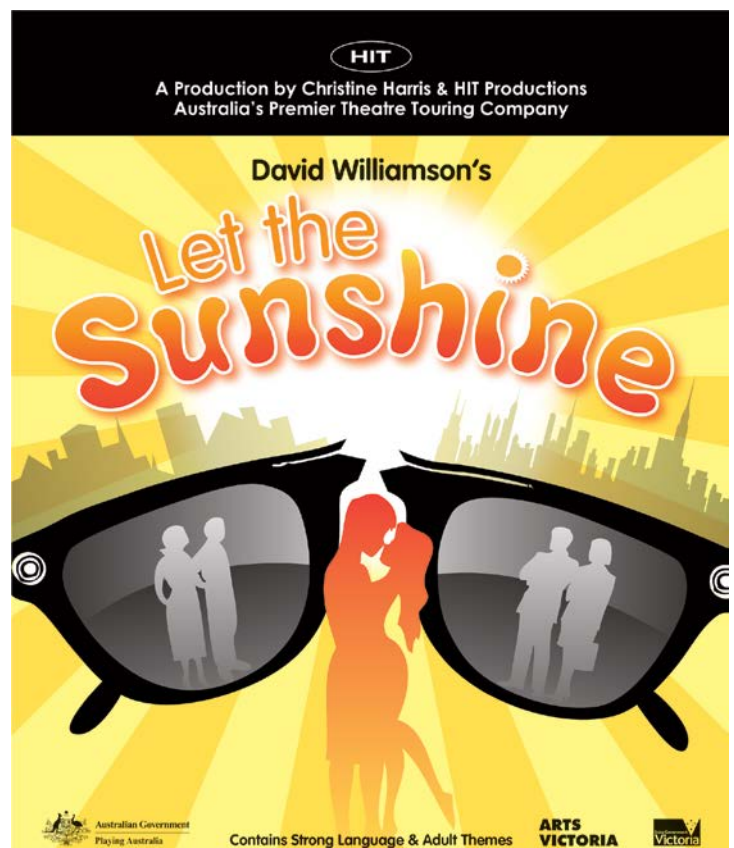

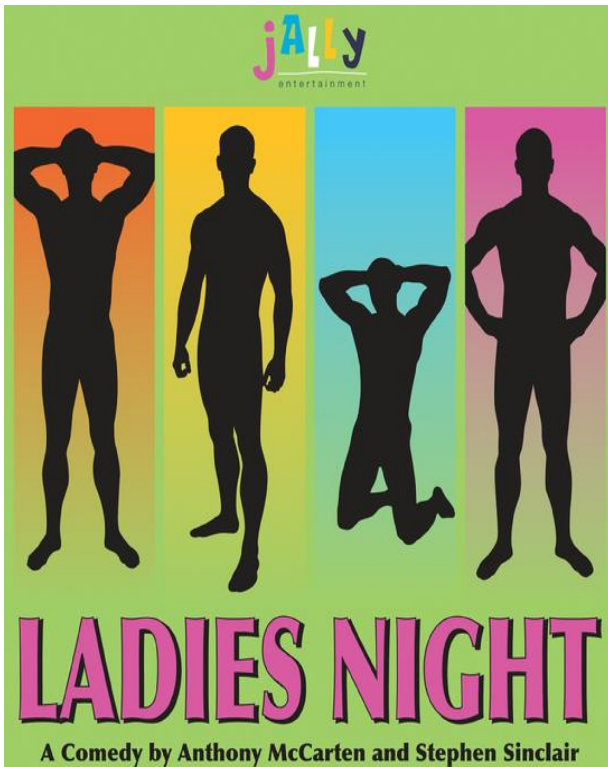

Written in 1987, by Anthony McCarten and Stephen Sinclair, *Ladies Night* has been translated into twelve languages and remains New Zealand's most commercially successful play, of all time.
